Facility Managers (FM) are the facilities and operations management experts at U.S. diplomatic missions around the world. They direct operations, lead, and supervise large and diverse workforces at overseas posts while providing a wide range of facility-related services for commercial and residential U.S. Government (USG) buildings.

The following is required:

- Bachelor's degree with 3 yrs. or Master's degree with 2 yrs. specialized experience, or Bachelor's in Facility Management or Facility Engineering
- Worldwide availability
- U.S. citizenship
- Between 21-59 yrs. old to be appointed

In return for your service, you will receive paid housing and K-12 education for dependent children when serving overseas, training and career development, and federal retirement benefits.

Consider a public service career with the U.S. Department of State Bureau of Overseas Buildings Operations (OBO) and contribute to leading and managing challenging projects, while connecting with global communities, communicating U.S. foreign policy, and having a positive impact economically, socially, and environmentally on the locations where our employees serve.

Applicants must be U.S. citizens, at least 20 years old to apply, and at least 21 years old to be appointed. By law, all career candidates must be appointed to the Foreign Service prior to the month in which they reach age 60, except for preference-eligible veterans.
