The Foreign Service Act and appropriate personnel regulations require three (3) commitments from candidates for appointment to the Foreign Service.

1.	Candidates for the Foreign Service should understand that members of the Foreign Service available for worldwide service, as are all members of their immediate families. In the official performance of their duties as representatives of the United States Government, Foreign Service members may be called upon to support and defend policies with which they may not be personally in full agreement. On such occasions, normal standards of Foreign Service discipline will apply. Ample opportunity is provided within official channels for discussion and dissent with respect to the development and conduct of United States Foreign policy.	
	You should understand that acceptance of these three (3) basic commitments - availability assignment, willingness to accept out-of-function assignments, and observance of Foreign respect to public support of established United States policy - is a condition of employment Service.
